GREAT FALLS MAN DROWNED IN RIVER

DAN LOCHARAY ATTEMPTS TO
SWIM RIVER AT PAOLI AND
LOSES HIS LIFE.

Dan Locharay, a resident of Great Falls, was drowned yesterday afternoon when he attempted to swim across the river at Paoli.

Locharay was investigating some coal prospects in the vicinity and attempted to swim the river in order to look at some claims on the other side. The middle fork of the Flathead at that point is swift and treacherous, and it is presumed that the undercurrent dragged him down. No trace of the body had been found, according to reports to the sheriff's office today.

The funeral will be held at 2 o'clock Friday afternoon at the home of Miss Sylvia Larson, west of the city. Burial will be in the Conrad Memorial cemetery.

Mrs. Hannon was one of the pioneers of the Flathead valley and was highly respected by all who knew her.

**FUNERAL OF W. E. MORAND
HELD YESTERDAY MORNING**

The funeral of W. E. Morand was held yesterday morning at 10 o'clock at St. Matthews church, Rev. Father O'Farrell conducting the services.

Mr. Morand was born at Ste Martine, Quebec, Canada March 31, 1870, and came to Kalispell from British Columbia in 1908. He had always been in the best of health until Sunday, February 1, when he was taken ill with appendicitis, and was operated upon the following day. His case was critical, but he rallied and was making good progress until Wednesday when he took a turn for the worse. Pneumonia developed on Saturday, and his death occurred at 7:30 Sunday evening, February 8.

He leaves to mourn his loss his wife, Mrs. W. E. Morand, his daughter, Miss Elarion and son Lawrence and a brother at Devon, Mont.

He had other relatives living in eastern Canada, whom he visited last summer for the first time in 20 years when he and his family made an automobile trip to his old home.

**RINGLING MAN DIES
SUDDENLY AT COL. FALLS**

The death of Wesley David Newton of Ringling, occurred Sunday evening at Columbia Falls, caused by gurgitation of the heart. The deceased had been ill for some time, but had partially recovered, and went to Columbia Falls to visit Dr. Reynolds, an old college chum. When he got off the train Sunday morning he was seriously ill, and died at 2 o'clock. The body will be shipped to Ringling, where the Odd Fellows will hold services. From there it will be taken to White Sulphur Springs for burial.

MISSOULA DENTIST KILLED.

Missoula, June 3.—Dr. Joseph Oettinger, age 52, prominent dentist, was instantly killed tonight when his automobile overturned three miles west of Drummond. Chief Quartermaster E. L. Miller, in charge of the local navy recruiting station, was in the car with Dr. Oettinger, but escaped with serious bruises. Dr. Oettinger has a brother in Chicago and a sister, Henrietta Oettinger, in Portland, Ore.

MAJOR SHARP IS SHOT AND KILLED

Missoula, July 24.—Major Theodore Sharp, superintendent of the Flathead Indian agency, was shot and killed today at Ravalli, according to a report received here. Local authorities say the shooting was done by N. J. Perkins, a sub-agent, whom Major Sharp had just dismissed, charging that he was in sympathy with bootleggers. Perkins, according to the report, stood off the residents and a deputy and escaped in an automobile to his home at St. Ignatius, where he telephoned the sheriff to come and get him.

BODY OF WAR HERO ARRIVES HERE TODAY

The body of Private Jerry H. Sullivan, who died in the German prison hospital at Trier, October 30, 1918, arrived in Kalispell this morning in charge of Private Engle of Fort Sheridan, Wyoming, who was detailed for the duty by military authorities there.

Private Sullivan left here with his detachment on July 1, 1918, and after a few weeks in the training camp at Fort Dodge, was sent to the front. While in the fighting in Argonne he was captured on October 4, and taken to the military prison at Trier, where he contracted pneumonia from which he died on October 30. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Morty Sullivan, of Creston were notified of his death on December 21, and his body is the first of the world war heroes to be returned home for burial.

Funeral services will be held at St. Matthews church Monday, Oct. 15, at 11 o'clock. It will be attended by the American Legion, which will escort the body to Conrad Memorial Cemetery, where it will be given a military burial.
