FALLING TREE KILLS TWO NEAR LIBBY

Libby, Nov. 20.—William Grambauer, aged 20, and Norman Taylor, aged 25, were instantly killed Sunday afternoon when they were struck by a falling tree that crashed through a tent in which they and two others were sitting.

The two men were working on a forest service road 30 miles from Libby. Grambauer and Taylor were standing in the tent when a dead pine, 200 feet long, fell to the ground. The other two men were uninjured.

The body of Taylor will be shipped to his home in Chinook for burial. The Grambauer funeral will be held Wednesday afternoon from the Presbyterian church. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. W. Grambauer, live near Libby.

**MURDER MYSTERY AT
THOMPSON
FALLS**

**A. B. Siler, Cook Of Construction
Crew, Found With Throat Cut—
Wife Is Under Arrest**

Thompson Falls, Oct. 22.—Mrs. Lulu Siler was arrested today on a first degree murder charge in connection with the death of her husband, A. B. Siler, whose body, with the throat horribly slashed, was found yesterday morning near a Western Union Telegraph company construction car at Belknap siding, seven miles west of here.

Mr. and Mrs. Siler were cooks for the construction crew.

Prosecuting Attorney Alvord declared that Mrs. Siler did not report the finding of her husband's body until after she had prepared breakfast for the crew, following her purported discovery of it.

Officers are looking for a strange man said to have been around the car Saturday night.

The prosecuting attorney and Sheriff Keator intended to go to Spokane tonight, where Mr. and Mrs. Siler lived, to investigate their family affairs.
