**G. N. WATCHMAN DROPS
DEAD NEAR PAOLA**

Jamer Young, employed by the Great Northern Railway as a bridge watchman at what is known as the sink hole a mile east of Paola, dropped dead from heart trouble about 6 o'clock last evening. Edward Mulaney, also living there, was with him at the time of his death. Little is known of Mr. Young and his personal papers give no trace of any relatives. He was 61 years of age and has apparently lived in Flathead and Lincoln counties for many years. Coroner W. J. Miller went to Paola last night and brought the remains to the Sherman & Miller parlors at Kalispell this morning. No funeral arrangements will be announced until an effort has been made to locate relatives.
