Wisconsin, where they resided until the spring of 1893, when they moved to Norman county, Minnesota, Here they made their bonic for 22 years. In 1915 they moved to Flathead county and have lived here since.

Mrs. Gaustad was always a devoted member of the Lutheran church, taking a very active part in ladies' aid work, especially during her stay in Minnesota, where she served as president of a ladies; aid for many years, She sacrificed a great deal of time in ministering to the sick and the dying.
