

OBITUARY

Barney Lavelle, one of the oldest residents of Flathead county, who died at the Sisters' hospital Monday, February 16, after an illness of five days, was born in the county Monahan, Ireland. He was 80 years old at the time of his death.

Deceased came to this country in 1881 and with his family has lived here ever since, nine miles northwest of Kalispell. In 1910 he homesteaded a place on the reservation and was well known both at Polson and Kalispell.

Deceased is survived by his wife and eight children, all of whom were present at the funeral. Funeral services were held Saturday morning at 10 o'clock from St. Matthew's church, and interment was in the family lot in Conrad Memorial cemetery. The pall-bearers were Herb Kendall, Frank Porter, James Lang, Frank Kerns, James Fitzpatrick and Frank Reed.

Greenough K. Lycan was born near Marshall, Ill., May 7, 1849. Departed this life June 4, 1925, being 76 years and 28 days old.

He was married to Lucy Snedeker, May 21, 1882. To this union was born six children, four of whom are living, and eight grandchildren. Arthur, the eldest, having died in the year 1903. Mr. Lycan was educated in eastern Illinois, taught school seven years, afterward engaged in farming, retiring from active work and moving to Kalispell in 1906, where he has since resided.
