

### FUNERAL SERVICES FOR ELIJAH GREGG

Funeral services for Elijah Gregg were held Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock at Sherman and Son's chapel. Many friends attended the services which were conducted by Rev. B. Scott Bates, and the many floral tributes gave evidence of the high esteem in which this old pioneer was held.

Dr. Bates chose as his text for the service, Paul's words, "I have fought a good fight." Arthur Driscoll, accompanied by Mrs. Ross Young sang "Face to Face." Interment was made in the Conrad Memorial cemetery. Postoffice employees acted as pallbearers.

Elijah Kempt Gregg was born November 26, 1841 at Carlisle, Indiana. He married Jane L. Curry, March 13, 1866 at the home of her parents Miles and Cynthia Curry of Carlisle, Indiana the ceremony being performed by Rev. Howard of the Christian church. To this union eight children were born, six of whom are surviving, Effie Kliphouse, Sarah Schaffer, Emma Jamison, Ella Graves, Josie McDermott and Rosella Conningham.

Mr. Gregg and family came to Montana in 1884 and made their home at Bonita, then in the Bitter Root valley and thence to Demersville where they were among the early settlers of this valley. Here he engaged in contracting and was in the forest service and was also chosen as one of the first rural mail carriers. After serving 11 years in the mail service he resigned and went to the Montana State Soldiers' Home where he lived until the time of his death. He served three years in the army and was honorably discharged. Mr. Gregg was 85 years of age at the time of his death, January 5, 1927. His wife died June 20, 1916.

#### Obituary

Carrie Grinde was born near Trondhjem, Norway, January 19, 1854.

She came to America with her husband in 1881 and settled in Minneapolis, Minnesota, until 1891, when she came with her family to Flathead county where she has since resided. For the past five years her health failed and she passed away at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Gus Dukleth at Creston, Montana, May 17, 1927, at the age of 73 years and 4 months.

Her husband, Ole Grinde, passed away November 12, 1918.

Left to mourn her death are eight children: Mrs. Mary Robertson of Kalispell, Mrs. Sadie Bryson, Ed. and Henry Grinde of Whitefish, Mrs. Cora Dukleth of Creston, Frances Grinde of Billings and Fred and Adolph Grinde of San Francisco. Besides her children the deceased is survived by a sister, Mrs. Nels Hugdahl, a brother, Jens Foss, both of Minneapolis, Minnesota, and 18 grandchildren.

Interment was made in the Conrad Memorial cemetery beside her husband.
