January 3, 1916 he was united in marriage to Miss Bertha Bailey, and to this union four children were born. The family moved from Trego to Fardine about a year ago. Mr. OIstad became seriously ill three last Tuesday, and was removed to the local hospital, where he passed away November 22, aged 39 years.
