In 1891 she was married to Andrew Rogstad. They lived for a time in Minnesota and at Big Sandy, Montana, coming to Kalispell in 1919.

Mrs. Rogstad passed away December 18, 1927 at the age of 65 years. She is survived by her husband, Andrew Rogstad; a son, Lundmoe Rogstad; a daughter, Mrs. E. H. West and a grandson, Oliver I. Engebretson all of Kalispell.

**HOLD FUNERAL SERVICES

Funeral services for George Roper were conducted Wednesday afternoon in the Waggener and Campbell chapel, which proved inadequate for the throngs of friends assembled. Some 60 or 70 persons were obliged to remain outside in other rooms or on the street.

The sermon was preached by Rev. G. M. Fisher, and a quartet composed of Clyde, Burt and Lyle Carr and W. F. Ruegsegger, sang several hymns.

Mr. Roper having been a member of both the Owl and Woodman lodges, the pall-bearers were representative of these two organizations and were: James Boysen, M. J. Tucker, H. H. Buck, J. M. Parsons, Eugene McCarthy, Richard Riedel. The Woodmen conducted the services at the grave in Conrad Memorial cemetery.

George Roper was born in Barnsley, Yorkshire, England. At the time of his death he was 57 years old.

He came to America with his parents when he was four years of age, living first in Boston and later in Detroit. Some 27 years ago he came west to Bonners Ferry, Idaho, and here was married to Miss Selma Blomberg. For the last 26 years he had made his home in Kalispell.

He is survived by his wife and two daughters, Florence and Edna and by three brothers, Jack, of Ottawa, Canada, Robert of Detroit and William of Detroit. The latter came to Kalispell to attend the funeral.
