Andrew Hanson was born in Norway, September 21, 1848. His parents' names were Hans and Anna Hanson. He was united in marriage in 1872 to Miss Hanna Hoakensen and 10 children were born to them, among whom the following survive: Mrs. A. Newman of Superior, Wisconsin; Amen Hanson of Tacoma, Washington; and A. W. Hanson, Mrs. W. F. Lenox, Peter Hanson, Ole Hanson and Mrs. T. J. Alexander of Kalispell.

Mr. Hanson came to America in 1880, settling first in Duluth, and coming west to Kalispell from that city in 1900.
