Obituary

Mrs. Ella W. Tadlock was born at Cordova, Rock Island county, Illinois, November, 1854, being 74 years old at the time of her death. Her maiden name was Ella W. Smith. She was united in marriage to S. S. Tadlock of Kimball, South Dakota, December 3, 1892, but lost her husband within four months.

She remained a widow, giving her time and strength to aiding and taking care of others in sickness.

Mrs. Tadlock became a member of the Cordova Baptist church in her early life and continued a consistent Christian woman until her death, which occurred at the home of her sister, Mrs. J. E. Jackson, 519 Third avenue east, Monday morning.

While living in Williston, North Dakota, she affiliated with the Congregational church, as there was no Baptist organization in that city, and was a member of that church at the time of her death.

She leaves one sister, Mrs. Jackson of Kalispell; a brother in Moline, Illinois; a brother in Cordova, Illinois, and a third in Steuben, Wisconsin.
