The last rites for Mrs. Marf E. Elder were held Sunday at 4 o'clock in the Waggener & Campbell chapel. The Rev. J. H. Frame of Polson conducted the services, assisted by the Rev. H. C. Mecklenberg of Columbia Falls.

Two appropriate selections were rendered by Rev. and Mrs. Frame, with Pettit accompanying at the piano. The chapel was filled with sympathizing friends and many beautiful flowers were arranged about the casket. Pallbearers were John Hall, Fred Pettit, O. M. Junkins, W. F. Johnson, W. F. Triplett, and J. W. Huston. Interment was made in the Conrad Memorial cemetery and the services of the Eastern Star were conducted by the Estella Pomeroy chapter of Columbia Falls.

Mary Edna Crouse, daughter of Rosana and Jacob Crouse, was born December 27, 1859, at Detroit, Michigan. With her parents she moved to Manchester, Iowa, in the year 1870. As a young woman she taught school until the time of her marriage and on September 28, 1879, she was united in marriage to Cornelius D. Elder. They made their home at Osage, Iowa, in southern Minnesota for eight years after which they returned to Manchester, where they lived until 1906. In May of 1906, Mr. and Mrs. Elder and daughter came to Columbia Falls, where Mr. Elder passed away in September 1922.

One daughter, Mrs. Madge Hollister, and three grandchildren, Elizabeth, Nell, and Milton survive. She is also survived by one sister and two brothers, Mrs. Anna Dawson of Chicago, Charles Crouse, of Minneapolis, and George Crouse of Manchester, Iowa.

At an early age Mrs. Elder united with the Baptist church, but after coming to Montana she affiliated with the Methodist church at Columbia Falls. Her deep and abiding faith in God was a great comfort to her during her long illness.

She had been a member of Estella Pomeroy Chapter O. E. S., for the past 12 years. Mrs. Elder passed away August 8, at 1:30 a. m., after an illness of several months.
