## OBITUARY

W. H. Twining, who died suddenly Saturday, May 3, was born near Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. At the age of 17 he became an apprentice in carpentry and after learning his trade, went to Philadelphia, where he was for many years superintendent of construction for Samuel B. McDowell, general contractor of Philadelphia. Under his supervision buildings were erected in Philadelphia, Atlantic City, Chicago and other eastern cities. He also spent one winter in Florida where he was engaged in building. In 1901 he made his first trip to Kallispell and since 1905, had made Kallispell his permanent home. Mr. Twining continued in the construction work, upon taking his residence here, and erected several buildings, his last work being the residence which he built in 1922.

On July 23, 1913, he married Mrs. Christine M. Lillevig and to them, one son, Wainisley H. Jr., was born. Mr. Twining leaves a brother, Milton Twining of Newton, Pennsylvania and Mrs. W. H. Adcock of Red Bank, New Jersey. He also leaves a step-son Carlyle J. Lillevig.
