Knute H. Robbin was born in Haugesund, Norway, August 19, 1852 and came to this country at the age of 11. After his elementary schooling he attended Carleton college in Northfield, Minnesota and Augsburg seminary at Minneapolis, Minnesota.

July 14, 1884 he was married to Augusta Olson at Fergus Falls, Minnesota, and to this union there were born ten children, all of whom survive him. Mrs. Robbin passed away in 1906.

Until 1915 he was engaged in the furniture and hardware business after which he moved to Kalispell, Montana.

In 1917 he was united in marriage to Jenny Hannes of Minneapolis, who together with his children and their families were at his bedside when he passed away. He died Sunday afternoon, October 18, 1931 at 6 o'clock.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Jennie Robbin; his sons, Hector E., Rudolph J., F. Arthur, Raymond O., George K., and Walter G.; and four daughters: Mrs. A. A. Dodge, Mrs. J. G. Edmiston, Mrs. R. Mr. Robbin was a gentleman of the old school, honest and upright in all his dealings, faithful to his friends and family. He was a deeply spiritual man and was faithful to his church, the Bethlehem Lutheran of this city. His passing is deeply regretted by a host of friends. He was a fine example of the best type of citizen that Norway sent to this country during the last half of the 19th century.
