BODY OF W. C. TACHARY FOUND BESIDE ROAD, EVIDENTLY A SUICIDE

LETTERS TO RELATIVES INDICATE THAT HE HAD IN-TENDED TO TAKE OWN LIFE—BODY FOUND ON ROAD FROM FOYS LAKE TO PATRICK CREEK. WHERE HE HAD SPENT THE NIGHT

The body of a man believed to be Walter C. Zachary was found early this afternoon near the Kind place on the road from Foys lake to Patrick creek, and officers believe that it is clearly a case of suicide.

One letter addressed to Mrs. W. C. Zachary, 236 Fourth avenue west, and another apparently to his children, indicated that he had intended taking his own life. He had been shot through the head, and a .38 caliber revolver was lying beside the body. An empty ether can also indicated that he may have attempted to and his life that way.

The first news was received by Judge McCarthy in a telephone message from a man giving the name of Gottleib Bischoff. Officers were notified and Deputy Sheriff Francis Ripke and Raymond Waggener went to the scene of the tragedy. An investigation convinced them that it was clearly a case of suicide. Early this afternoon, Hazel Kind, daughter of Mrs. Mary Kind, discovered the body, and rushed home telling her mother a man was lying beside the road badly hort. An investigation by older members of the family showed that the man was dead.

Zachary's car, a Ford compe, was standing beside the road, and he had evidently driven to the spot some time yesterday. He had gone into the brush a short distance and had evidently made his bed and stayed there during the night. He had rolled up his bed this morning and his body was found beside it. Mrs. Kind told the officers she heard a shot about 8 or 2:30 this morning, but thought nothing of it at the time.

From papers in his pockets Zachary had been living at the Two Ping
