

MRS. MARY ELLIOT DIES IN CALIFORNIA

Word was received in Kalispell yesterday of the death of Mrs. Mary Elliot, mother of T. W. and W. G. Elliot of this city, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. W. L. Gentz, Hollywood, California, February 6, where she has made her home for the past 12 years. She has been in ill health for the past three years, and her death was not unexpected.

Mrs. Elliot was born in Ontario, Canada, April 5, 1847, where she lived with her parents until September 1, 1873, when she was married to Christopher C. Elliot. In 1881 they moved to South Dakota and went through the many hardships incidental to pioneer life in that great state. The family moved to St. Paul in 1902, and there her husband and one son died in 1907. She remained there until 1912, when she came with her three sons to Kalispell, moving to her daughter's home in Hollywood in 1921.

She is survived by her two sons, Thomas W. and William G. of Kalispell, her daughter, Mrs. W. L. Gentz of Hollywood; eight grandchildren, and one sister, Mrs. Agnes Elliot of Hamburg, Ontario. Her son, John C. Elliot, died in Kalispell January 31, 1919.

Interment will be made in Rose-lawn cemetery, St. Paul, Minn.
