Word was received in Kalispell yesterday of the death of Mrs. Mary Elliot, mother of T. W. and W. G. Eliot of this city, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. W. L. Gentz, Hollywood, California, February 6, where she has made her home for the past 12 years. She has been in ill health for the past three years, and her death was not unexpected.
