Mary Aloise Fiedler was born in Neisse, Schlesien, Germany, on June 5, 1886. When she was six years of age her family migrated to the United States and established a home in Minnesota. From there they moved to Great Falls, where on November 29, 1906, Mary Aloise was married to George Wilbur Noffsinger. In the latter part of the year 1909, Mr. and Mrs. Noffsinger moved to Somers, where they lived until the spring of 1924. At that time they came to Kalispell. On Friday, January 26, in the Sisters' of Mercy hospital, she passed away. Solemn Requiem High Mass was said by the Rev. Father Francis O'Farrell, assisted by Father Sullivan of Browning and Glacier Park, in St. Matthew's church, Monday morning, January 29, at 10 a. m. The beautiful service paid fitting tribute to her, whose lovely character and profound faith were known to the people of this community.
