Obituary

Charles B. Yeaw was born January 31, 1853, in Florida, Mass. At the age of 14 he moved with his parents to Heath, Mass., where they remained until he was 20 years old. They then moved to Trevor, Wisconsin. In 1906 Mr. Yeaw came to the Flathead and with the exception of a few years spent in Massachusetts, had lived here since. He was married in 1876 to Miss Carrie Vose of Jacksonville, Vermont. Twelve years later Mrs. Yeaw passed away. Mr. Yeaw had been in broken health for many years and passed away early Tuesday morning, April 3 at the home of his daughter in Kalispell. From old New England stock he inherited a high standard of truth and integrity, to which he adhered strictly throughout his life. He was a man of exceptionally fine character. By clean living and thinking he built up a personal philosophy of life, which gave him an understanding that was ever a source of comfort to himself and an enlightenment to others:
