CATHERINE C. VAN DUZER

Impressive funeral rites were held at 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon for Mrs. Catherine C. Van Duzer, whose death occurred suddenly early Saturday morning.

The Waggener & Campbell chapel was filled to capacity with the many friends Mrs. Van Duzer had made during a lifetime spent almost entirely in Kalispell, and a great profusion of flowers gave evidence of the high esteem in which she was held. The service was conducted by Rev. Charles Wilson, of Billings, former rector of Christ Episcopal Church, of which Mrs. Van Duzer had been a member since childhood. During the service Clyde Carr, accompanied by Mrs. Carr, sang three beautiful hymns. The bearers were C. A. Hummer, Harry C. Keith, M. J. Hall, Arthur J. Burch, Hans Walchli, E. S. Dickey, and Gilbert Miller.

The body was placed in the family mausoleum in the Conrad Memorial cemetery.

Her death came as a great shock to her family and friends. About three weeks ago she submitted to an operation for acute appendicitis, and was making a splendid recovery. It was thought she was past all danger but death came suddenly as the result of an embolism at about 3 o'clock Saturday morning, July 13.

Mrs. Van Duzer was born in Fort Benton June 12, 1885, the elder daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. C. E. Conrad, Montana pioneers, who were among the early and most influential and public-spirited citizens of Kalispell. She came here with the family in 1891; graduated from the local schools, and finished her education in Spokane and Boston. She was married to E. J. Van Duzer February 24, 1908, and beside her husband is survived by her brother, C. D. Conrad and her sister, Mrs. George H. Campbell.

Mrs. Van Duzer was a true friend of all with whom she came in contact, warm-hearted and generous, and will long be remembered for her many acts of kindness and thoughtfulness for others.
