

CHARLES F. CALBICK

Obituary

Charles F. Calbick was born August 11, 1859, in Ontario, Canada. About 1877 he came to the United States and settled in Wyoming. After a short stay in Colorado with his brother, George, he again returned to Wyoming, where he was united in marriage to Mary McLaughlin. Mr. and Mrs. Calbick lived for six years in South Dakota, and for a time in North Dakota. In the fall of 1908 they moved to the Flathead valley and took up a ranch near Creston. This was Mr. Calbick's home until the time of his death.

Their one child, a daughter born in 1886, died in 1911. Mrs. Calbick died in 1928.

Mr. Calbick died in the Kalispell hospital on Sunday, April 26, 1936, at the age of 77 years. He is survived by one brother, George Calbick, and several nieces and nephews.
