**Obituary**

Michael Quilligan was born Oct. 5, 1855, in County Limerick, Ireland, and came to the United States when he was 14 years of age. He was among the early pioneers in Montana and lived for a time at Helena. He came to the Flathead in 1891 and helped build the railroad through this section. Later he began farming in the lower valley where he lived until 1929, when he moved to Hot Springs, where he built several houses near the Government Springs. He passed away there Oct. 25, 1937, following a brief illness, aged 82 years. He is survived by his widow and other relatives.
