He was born in England April 20, 1851 and died at Big Sandy July 21, 1938, aged 87 years. He came to the United States in 1869 after serving two years in the British army. He was married to Christina Evenson at LaCrosse, Wis., in July 3, 1874 and in 1880 came to Helena. They moved to the Flathead in 1886 taking up a homestead east of Kalispell where they lived until 1904 when they moved to town.
