Obituary

Ellen Spande Rask was born on the Island of Finno, near Stavanger, Norway on April 29, 1856 and passed away in Kalispell on May 12, 1938, after an illness of two months. She lost her father at an early age and as one of 8 children was raised by a widowed mother. In her early twenties she came to America to the home of an uncle in southern Minnesota and a few years later moved to Hendrum, Minn., where an older sister lived and when she met and married Halvor J. Rask. Four children were born to them, D. Olaf Rask, of Baltimore; Joseph, who passed away as a small child; Harold, who passed away eight years ago and Miss Inga Rask of this city.

In 1906 the family came to this valley and established their home northwest of Kalispell. Mr. Rask passed away in 1929. Since then Mrs. Rask had divided her time between her home here and the family home at Hendrum, Minn., where the family of her son, Harold live.

Besides her son and daughter, Mrs. Rask leaves to mourn her loss three grandsons, Olaf N. Rask of Baltimore, Harold James Rask and Allan Burnett Rask of Hendrum, Minn; a brother, Jakob Spande in Norway; a sister, Mrs. John Berg of Chiliwank, British Columbia; a brother, Rev. T. J. Spande of Peterson, Minn., and 30 nieces and nephews, one of whom Miss Josephine Stennes of Rugby, N. D. was with her during her last illness. Among more distant relatives she leaves the four Fagerland brothers and John Aadson all of Creston, Mont.

Mrs. Rask was a charter member of St. Paul Lutheran church of Hendrum, Minn. She retained her membership there but took an active interest in the Bethlehem Lutheran church of this city.

Her earthly remains will be taken to Minnesota where services will be held and she will be laid to rest beside her husband and two sons, who have preceded her.
