

**GEO. W. LANSTRUM**

Although not wholly unexpected, the many friends of Geo. W. Lanstrum were grieved today to learn of his death, which occurred at 2 o'clock this morning at the Kalspell General hospital, where he was taken yesterday morning.

Mr. Lanstrum had been in failing health for several years, but had been up and about the streets until about a week ago, when he suffered an attack of asthma, from which he was unable to recover.

Interment will be in Helena, his old home, with funeral services Saturday, October 28 at 2:30, under the auspices of the Masonic lodge.

Mr. Lanstrum was born at Calces-

burg, Ill., August 24, 1874. He came to Montana in 1901, and was married to Miss Bess Hendricks at Helena, November 1, 1905. He was a member of the state legislature for two sessions; had served as commissioner of Lewis and Clark county; and was appointed by the late Governor Dixon as chairman of the first State Highway Commission. He also served as postmaster at Helena during the Taft administration.

He came to Kalspell in 1926, when he purchased the Kalspell Hotel, which he has since operated. Since coming to Kalspell he has always taken a keen interest in civic affairs, and was very active in highway matters, both locally and in the state, and was a director of the Montana State Automobile association.

Besides Mrs. Lanstrum he is survived by a brother, C. E. Lanstrum of Missoula, and a sister, Mrs. Howard Waterman of Los Angeles.

He was a member of the Elks Lodge and of the various Masonic bodies, and a past potentate of Algeria Shrine at Helena.
