Obituary

Paul Foot was born August 4, 1888, in St. Cloud, Minnesota, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Eugene S. Foot. He grew up in Minnesota and came to Montana in 1909. He enlisted in the National Guard in 1910 serving in Company F of the 2nd Montana Infantry, and was thereafter active in the National Guard. He served on the Mexican border in 1916, and on October 20, 1917, was commissioned and went to France with the 163rd Infantry in December of that year. He saw much active service and was decorated by the French and American governments. He was badly wounded in the Battle of the Argonne on November 11, just before the signing of the Armistice. He was invalided home and remained at the Walter Reed hospital for treatment until 1922, being retired from active service and assigned to the Officers' Reserve Corps in December, 1922. He returned to Montana in 1928 and had since been engaged in farming and stock raising on the Flathead reservation near Niaraia.

He passed away August 15, 1941, at Babb, Montana, at the age of 53 years. His parents and one brother predeceased him. He is survived by three brothers, Guy K., Harold S., and Walter L. Foot, and an uncle, C. H. Foot, of Kalispell; an aunt, Ida M. Anderson of Bolgrade, Minnesota, and many other relatives.
