1908 she moved to Montana near Nashua and lived on a homestead until 1923 when she came to Kalispell. She remained here until her recent illness a short time ago when she went to Malta to be with her brother, where she passed away Feb. 7, 1941, at the age of 71 years.

Sophia A. Johnson was born June 10, 1885, to Claus and Bergitte Johannesen in Bo Parish Vesteraalen, Norway. She passed away January 5, 1941, at her home near Bigfork, at the age of 85 years.

She was married in 1878 to Hans Baade Johnson who passed away in 1887. She, together with her two children, left Norway two years later and came to this country to Sanborn, O'Brien county, Iowa, where her brother, Christian Clausen, lived. She came to Flathead county in the spring of 1886 and settled in the Holt vicinity that fall where she had made her home since.

Surviving are her daughter, Petra, and son, Kaurin B., of Bigfork; two brothers, Christian Clausen of Bigfork and Andreas Clausen of Norway; 12 grandchildren and four great-grandchildren, and other relatives, both in this country and Norway.

She was a pioneer in the Flathead and also in community and church work. She organized the first Lutheran Ladies aid in the Swan River community, and was president of the society for many years.
