

CHARLES A. UFFORD

Funeral services for Charles A. Ufford were held Tuesday afternoon at 3:30 at the Waggener and Campbell chapel by Rev. F. D. Hillis. During the services Don Shepard sang two solo selections accompanied at the organ by Mrs. J. M. Carlson. The entire front of the chapel was banked high with beautiful floral tributes and friends filled the chapel and adjoining rooms for the services. Six police officers from the Kalispell force of which Mr. Ufford was a member, acted as pallbearers. They were Levi Gaustad, James Curtis, Meade James, Raymond Kent, Orville Fredenberg, and Palmer Christopherson. Interment was in the Conrad Memorial cemetery.

Obituary

Charles Alfred Ufford was born in Hubbard, Iowa, April 23, 1881, and was educated in the schools of Iowa. He was married to Anna Wolf at Minot, N. D., in 1903, and shortly afterward came to Montana, where they have since lived. He was engaged in the cattle business in eastern Montana from 1903 to 1917, when he came to Kalispell, and operated a motor bus line between Kalispell and Whitefish. In 1923 he was appointed a deputy sheriff by Robert Fitzpatrick, after which he served on the Kalispell police force, which position he was holding at the time of his death.

He leaves to mourn his loss, his wife, Anna Ufford, and his son, Clarence Ufford of Kalispell, two granddaughters, Virginia and Patricia Ufford, and two sisters, Mrs. May Deitz of Mason City, Iowa, and Mrs. Sarah Cuse of Yakima, Wash.
