Obituary

Cornelius Hermanos VandenBos was born in Haarlem, Holland, on October 22, 1878. During his youth which he spent in that community he followed the railroad profession in which he served as a conductor.

At the age of 28 he was married to Harrietta Baas. To this union were born 11 children of which five boys and two girls are living at the present time.

The family came to America in 1909 and settled in Armour, South Dakota. One year later they moved to Montana and settled near Valier. In the year 1916 Mr. VandenBos became a citizen of the United States.

In 1922 his wife passed away and the following year he returned to Holland, at which time he was married to Mrs. Elizabeth Van Eck. To this union were born three children, two of which are living.

Mr. VandenBos farmed for many years in the Valier area and moved to Kalispell in 1940 where he has made his home since. He passed away Oct. 22, 1943, on his 65th birthday.

He is survived by his wife; nine children who are: Nicholas, Harry, Mrs. John Harris, William, Johanna, Jacoba, Direk, Carl, Garrett and Cornelius; one step son, Joseph Van Eck; five brothers and five sisters; 23 grandchildren and many nieces and nephews. He is also survived by a host of friends and neighbors who deeply mourn his passing.
