Max Paul Naethe was born March 11, 1874, in Berlin, Germany. He grew to manhood there and in 1896 was married to Miss Martha Burkhard. They came to the United States in 1903 and made their home at Kalispell. They lived since that time just northwest of the city.

Mr. Naethe met with an automobile accident Sunday afternoon west of Kalispell and passed away a few hours later at a local hospital on Oct. 15, 1944, at the age of 70 years.

He had been a cement contractor here for many years.
