Mr. O'Neil became a member of the Presbyterian church at an early age and was elder at the age of 21. In Kalispell he had served as elder of the First Presbyterian church for 23 years.

He is survived by his wife, Frieda E. O'Neil, at home, two sons, Louis C. O'Neil and C. Byron O'Neil of Kalispell; one daughter Mrs. C. E. Gillie of Seattle, Wash., two brothers, C. I. O'Neil of Pomona, Cal., and C. D. O'Neil of Kalispell.
