Hector D. Noble was born in Kent, Mich., December 16, 1880. While he was a small boy the family moved to Warren, Minn., where he spent his boyhood. He attended school in Minneapolis, Minn. He came to Kallispell in 1900 where he resided until his death July 8, 1945. On January 30, 1908, he was united in marriage to Mary Maude Galbick. To this union two children were born, Margaret Elizabeth and William Edward. The latter passed away in infancy.
