Hector D. Noble was born in Kent, Mich., December 16, 1880. While he was a small boy the family moved to Warren, Minn., where he spent his boyhood. He attended school in Minneapolis, Minn. He came to Kalispell in 1900 where he resided until his death July 8, 1945. On January 30, 1905, he was united in marriage to Mary Maude Gallick. To this union two children were born, Margaret Elizabeth and William Edward. The latter passed away in infancy.

Fifty and a half years ago Mr.

Noble retired from the Kalispell police force because of ill health after 12 years of service. He leaves to mourn his passing his widow, Mrs. Mary Maude Noble; one daughter, Mrs. Margaret Stripp; and three grandchildren. One brother in California and two sons in Portland, Oregon, also survive.
