Robert Franklin Calderwood was born Feb. 7, 1884 in LaSalle county Ill. He grew to young manhood there and moved to Iowa. In 1914 he came to Montana to make his home at Glasgow. He came to the Flathead in 1937 and lived at Woods Bay where he was employed at the Edmiston cherry orchards.

He passed away in Kalispell Jan. 25, 1946, at the age of 61 years.
