Robert Reynolds Farrington was born December 30, 1908 at Princeton, Minnesota to Charles and Daisy Farrington. At the age of five months he moved to Kalispell with his parents and grew up here, attending grade and high school, and graduating with the class of 1928. On October 22, 1934 he was united in marriage to Miss Glada Hollingsworth and to this union two sons were born, James and William. Mr. Farrington was associated with his father as masonry contractors and house movers in Kalispell for a number of years. He left this work a few years ago and had since been engaged in heavy construction work in China, California and lately in Kennewick, Wash., where he was employed by the Atkinson Construction company. Mr. Farrington died in Kennewick on January 3, 1948 as the result of an automobile accident. He was 39 years of age.

Surviving him are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Farrington, now living in Whitefish; two children, James and William, of Kalispell; one sister, Mrs. F. F. (Nellie) Bronson, of Whitefish and three uncles, Fred, Lee and Ed Veal.

Kenneth Eldon Felix was born January 21, 1922 at Bigfork, Montana to William L. and Mabel Felix, the youngest of four children. At the age of seven he moved with the family to Kalispell and there

attended grade and high school, graduating from Flathead county high with the class of 1940. Kenneth enlisted in Company F of the national guard in September of 1940 and received his training at Fort Lewis, Wash. In March, 1942 he was sent to the south Pacific with the 41st division.

On June 16, 1944 he was killed on Biak island while on duty as ammunition sergeant for the 163rd infantry regiment.

Kenneth was a member of the Epworth Methodist church and was active in youth fellowship and was also a member of the choir before enlisting in the army. He leaves to mourn his loss his mother, Mrs. Mabel Felix of Kalispell; one brother, William L. of Billings; two sisters, Virginia M. Ramsey of Kalispell and Frances L. Hensley of Havre, Montana and a number of other relatives. His father passed away at Bigfork, Montana on June 11, 1925.
