Funeral services for Charles Oscar Odenwald were held Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Waggener & Campbell chapel with a very large number of friends in attendance.

Obituary

Charles Oscar Odenwald was born December 12, 1884 at Fort Benton, Montana to Jacob and Magarett Zimmerman Odenwald. At an early age he moved to Helena with his parents where he received his education and grew to young manhood. Mr. Odenwald operated a meat market and ranch at Chateau for several years after leaving Helena.

In June of 1914 he was united in marriage to Grace E. Thomas at Helena. They came to the Flathead in 1918 and made their home in the Swan lake district for the first year. In 1919 they moved to Somers to make their home and where Mr. Odenwald was employed by the Somers Lumber company until his death on September 14, 1948. He was 63 years of age at the time of his passing.

Surviving him are his wife, Grace E. of Somers; one son, Charles of Bremerton, Washington; two brothers, Harry and William Odenwald of Orofino, Idaho and a half-sister, Mrs. Walter Jones of Wise River, Mont.

Oscar Theodore Olson was born March 14, 1917 at Froid, Montana, the son of Louis and Agot Tollefson Olson. He received his education there and in Bainville and on March 26, 1942 entered the U. S. army at Fort Lewis, Washington. He served in battery "D," 530th anti-aircraft artillery battalion until his discharge on February 2, 1946.

Mr. Olson came to the Flathead in June, 1948 and had been employed since in lumber mills in the Columbia Falls vicinity. He passed away there after a brief illness on October 25, 1948 at the age of 31 years.

Surviving him are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Louis Olson of Bainville, Mont.; three sisters, Mrs. Jim Hatcher of Kansas City, Mo., Mrs. Warren Bond of South Dakota and Miss Almo Olson of Kansas City, Mo.; and two brothers, Lawrence and Gilbert Olson of Helena.
