Mrs. Sallie Felton Dies; Rites Tuesday

Mrs. Sallie S. Felton, 82, died at her home on the East Lake Shore of Flathead Lake Saturday evening.

Mrs. Felton was born March 31, 1887, at Portsmouth, Va., a daughter of Charles and Annie Borchardt. She had received her education in Virginia having attended a business college there.

Sept. 9, 1908, she was married to William Pruden Felton at Lynn Haven, Va. Early in 1909, the couple moved to Montana where they had lived in Hill County. In 1916, they moved to Clear Creek in the Bear Paw Mountains and in 1931 to the Milk River Valley where they farmed until retiring and moving to the East Lake Shore area in 1952. They then operated the Felton Store at Woods Bay from 1952 to 1956.

Mrs. Felton was a member of the Bigfork United Methodist Church, the Order of the Eastern Star of Bigfork; the Rebekah Lodge of Chinook and Bigfork; the Bear Dance Ladies Club and was a charter member of the Lohman Loyalites of Chinook.

She was preceded in death by her husband, William, Oct. 11,

1963; one daughter, Anne Evelyn; one brother and one sister.

She is now survived by seven sons, Pruden Jr. of Chinook, Robert H. of Seattle, Wash., Thomas of Port Angeles, Wash., Raymond of Big Timber, Donald of Havre, Jack of Chinook, and Edward of Boise, Idaho; one daughter, Mrs. Don (Caroline) Morton of Bigfork; one sister, Mrs. Annie Throckmorton of Rupert, Idaho, 35 grandchildren and 25 great-grandchildren.

Funeral services for Mrs. Felton will be conducted in the Johnson Chapel at 10 a.m. Tuesday with the Rev. Chauncey Biffle, pastor of the Bigfork United Methodist Church officiating.

Following the services the body will be forwarded to Chinook where funeral services will be conducted at 2 p.m. Wednesday in the Eliason Chapel with interment to follow in the Chinook Cemetery. Hot Springs Man Dies Of Injuries

HOT SPRINGS — Lyle Fisher, 49, Hot Springs, died at a Missoula hospital of complications from injuries received Dec. 19 following a logging accident on the Ronan-Hot Springs cutover road.

Fisher received a fractured skull and other injuries after the power failed on his skidder and the machine tumbled down a steep embankment, smashing into a tree and overturning with Fisher riding out the tumbling plunge.
