COLUMBIA FALLS — Carl E. Karnes, 67, died in Kalispell Tuesday forenoon. Mr. Karnes was a resident of Hungry Horse.

He was born at Menomonie, Wis., Oct. 16, 1901. He grew up in Wisconsin and engaged in farming until 1947 when he moved to Faulkton, S. D., and in 1956, moved to Kalispell, where he worked as a heavy equipment operator until retiring 11 years ago because of ill health.

Found Dead**

SUN RIVER (AP) — A truck driver identified as Floyd Kyle, 29, Ulm, was found dead in his overturned 1½-ton grain truck early today.

Kyle's truck had rolled about six miles southeast of Sun River on a gravel road. It was loaded with wheat.

The investigating patrolman said the accident apparently occurred sometime after 6 p.m. Thursday but was not discovered until about 1 a.m. today. The wreckage was spotted by Skip Joseph of Augusta.

Kyle was pinned in the cab. The death was the 274th in Montana this year, compared to 239 on this date last year.
