BIGFORK — Harold William Nelson, 61, Bigfork, died in Galen Friday afternoon.

Mr. Nelson was born Oct. 30, 1908, at Norma, N.D., a son of Nels and Toni Nelson. He had attended schools in Richmond, Wis. and later moved to Minnesota and the Minot, N.D. area.

He moved to the Flathead Valley in the late 1930s and had been employed as a mechanic with various firms until 1957 when he engaged in the dairy business at Bigfork. He continued in the dairy business until 1965 when he retired due to ill health.

He was a member of the Bethany Lutheran Church.

Man's Death Attributed To Natural Causes

Natural causes was the determination made by Kalispell police and Deputy Coroner Charles Rhodes after investigating the death of Richard Nyquist, 73, 612 Ninth Ave. W.

Authorities were summoned by Mrs. Charles Endicott, 620 Ninth Ave. W., at 6:45 p.m. Thursday. Officers found Nyquist sitting in a chair at the kitchen table. Physical evidence at the scene indicated Nyquist had apparently died several hours prior to the time his body was found.

Officers called Rhodes to assist in the investigation.

Nyquist had been under a doctor's care for some time, according to Rhodes.

He was born July 24, 1896, in Alexandria, Minn., to John Ole and Kajsa Nyquist. He received his schooling in Minnesota and at the age of 15 went to North Dakota where he farmed until 1936. He then moved to Oregon where he married Julia Annetta Loy. He came to Montana in 1946. He made his living as a carpenter from 1936 until he went into semi-retirement.

He was preceded in death by his parents, two brothers, Oscar and Gust, and one sister, Annie.

He is survived by four children: Kenneth Richard, Elden Joseph of Cornelius, Ore., Stephen Carl of Kalispell and a daughter, Mrs. Gordon (Marjorie) Mero of Kalispell; seven grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews. Service arrangements will be announced by Waggener & Campbell Funeral Home.
