Robinson Hill "Bob" Zachary, 69, died Saturday at his home at 675 Concord Lane in Kalispell.

Mr. Zachary was born Nov. 9, 1900, at Arvada, Wyo., to Walter and Libby Zachary. He was educated in Buffalo, Wyo., and came to Montana about 1925.

Nov. 16, 1928, he was married to Georgia Kelso in Kalispell. He was employed as a logger in the Flathead until 1960 at which time he became a motel manager and managed motels in Hungry Horse and Polson before coming to Kalispell again to manage the Four Seasons Motel. He retired in 1968.
