HELENA (AP) Darell alexander Dubois, 22, of Helena, was killed early Saturday morning when he apparently fell from a fourth-floor window in the east-central part of Helena.

Dubois's body was discovered early Saturday morning by newsboys, who notified county officials. Lewis and Clark County Sheriff Dave Middlemas said Dubois was still alive when admitted to a Helena hospital, but died shortly thereafter.
