Troy Man Dies In Woods Accident

LIBBY — Lincoln County authorities are continuing to investigate aspects of a woods accident which resulted in the death of Charles Jellesed, 24, Troy. He was killed about 3:30 p.m. in the Lake Creek drainage 14 miles southwest of Troy when he was struck on the head by a log.

Sheriff John Fisher and Coroner Hal Gompf reported no witnesses to the accident. Jellesed was a member of a three-man crew working a skidding-jammer. He was hooking logs on the downhill side of the operation. The woods crew reported the log had come loose once and had been hooked back on the cable again. Apparently it came loose a second time and struck Jellesed inflicting the fatal injury.

He is survived by his parents at Spokane, and has other relatives in the Northwest Montana area.
