

Mrs. Joan Young Dies Wednesday, Service Friday

OLNEY — Mrs. Joan Marian Young, 40, died at her home in Olney Wednesday. She was born March 26, 1931, at Oklahoma City, Okla., a daughter of Loren and Myrtle Tilley. As a child she moved with her family to Onamia, Minn., where she received her education, graduating from high school there in 1949.

She then attended Bible College at St. Paul. June 7, 1950, she married Larry Young at Onamia. The couple lived in St. Paul until 1956, and have lived at Fortine, Stryker and Olney since. Mrs. Young was active in the work of the Community Church of Fortine.

She is survived by her widower at home; three sons, James, John and Larry, and two daughters, Loretta and Ruth. She is also survived by her mother, Mrs. Myrtle Harscher, Olney, and a twin brother, William E. Tilley of Hawaii. Young Funeral Rites Wednesday

Funeral services for Ethel and Hollis Young will be conducted in the Johnson Chapel at 11 a.m. Wednesday with the Rev. Dr. Odin A. Baugh, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church officiating.

Inferment will be in Glacier Memorial Gardens where ritualistic Masonic graveside rites will be conducted for Mr. Young by the Lake Lodge 150 AF&AM and ritualistic Eastern Star rites will be conducted by the Order of the Eastern Star Lodge of Bigfork.

Mr. and Mrs. Young died in Salinas, Calif., Saturday in an automobile accident. Mr. Young was born Sept. 9, 1893, at Bell Center, Wis., and had received his education in Wisconsin. In 1914, he moved to Chinook where he homesteaded. Mrs. Young was born Oct. 12, 1894, at Carbondale, Ill. She had attended Illinois schools and was a graduate of the Southern Illinois University at Carbondale. She then moved to Chinook where she taught in the rural schools.

The couple was married July 24, 1917, at Havre. They continued to farm for several years. In 1924 they purchased and operated a garage business in Chinook until 1933 when they purchased a hardware store which they operated until 1943. They then moved to the Creston area where they ranched until 1963 when they retired to their summer home on East Lake Shore which they had owned for 30 years.

They were members of the First Presbyterian Church of Kallispell; the Eastside Grange and the Order of the Eastern Star of Bigfork. Mr. Young was a member of Lake Lodge 150 AF&AM and had served continuously on the State Board of Forestry since his appointment July 1, 1954, by then Gov. J. Hugo Aronson. The couple is survived by two sons, Robert, Salinas, and Kenneth (Ted), Anderson, Ind.; four grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews. Mr. Young is also survived by one sister, Mrs. Ruby Patterson, Chinook, and Mrs. Young is survived by one sister, Mrs. A. M. (Lorena) Knowls of Yucaipa, Calif.
