
Plan Wednesday Services For Fred R. Uhde, Rollins

long time resident of Lake County, died Saturday in Kalispell.

He was born near Storm Lake, Iowa, Jan. 31, 1901, to Otto C. and Caroline Uhde. When he was five his parents moved to Okaton, S.D. In 1910 they moved to Rollins. Uhde has

He married Faith Maurine Bovee in Butte, June 8, 1920. Uhde was very active in the Rollins school system and a strong supporter of education. He served as a member of the Rollins school board for several vears. Uhde also served as a precinct Democratic committeeman since the 1920s - for two terms as Democratic chairman for Lake County.

The long-time Rollins resident spent several years in logging camps and sawmills in Bellingham, Wash. and Flathead districts before opening a store in Rollins in 1924. He operated his store continually until the present except between 1966-70 when he semi-retired. He also ran a gas station. For many years the Rollins Post Office was located within his store.

Uhde served as justice of the peace at Rollins since the mid-1930s. He wrote articles and columns for many local newspapers during the past 50 years, including The Daily Inter Lake, Kalispell News and Flathead Courier.

Besides his widow, Uhde is survived by four children - Mrs. R. J. (Mary) Friesen, Long Beach, Calif.; Richard Uhde, Kalispell; James Uhde, Rollins, and Mrs. Virgil (Carol) Weaver, Kalispell.

Other survivors include a sister, Mrs. E. D. (Mabel) Wiles, Burlington, Wash.; a brother, Harry Uhde, Seattle, Wash.; an aunt, Mrs. Mary Kenning, Sigourney, Iowa; a niece, Mrs. Joe Duffield, Libby; 17 grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. Wednesday at the Weatherford Funeral Home with J. Torrance Harvey, pastor of the Lakeside Chapel, officiating. Burial will be in Conrad Memorial Cemetery. The family suggests memorials to the Kalispell General Hospital building fund.
