He entered the Army during World War II while living in Kalispell and returned here after the service to work in the woods. He moved to Aberdeen in 1950 and was in construction work. He retired 18 months ago for health reasons. He returned to Kalispell two weeks ago.

Mass of the Resurrection for Robert John Guidoni, 37, was celebrated Tuesday in St. John Catholic Church, Butte, with the Rev. Gregory Burke, celebrant. Interment was in Holy Cross Cemetery.

Mr. Guidoni, partner in Glacier Equipment Co., Columbia Falls, died en route to North Valley Hospital Friday. He had a heart attack but had not been in ill health.

He was born Oct. 11, 1935 at Butte. He attended schools in Butte and was employed by Montana State Highway Department and Roberts Rocky Mountain Equipment Co. until entering the army, serving two years. Upon his honorable discharge from the service Mr. Guidoni returned to Butte and resumed his employment with Rocky Mountain Equipment Co. He was transferred to Great Falls in 1968, becoming branch manager for the company.

Mr. Guidoni and Larry Crowley purchased the northwestern Montana outlet of Roberts Rocky Mountain Equipment Co., Columbia Falls, in February, 1973. The Columbia Falls business was started in 1966 with Crowley as manager. The families had been longtime friends. Business name was changed to Glacier Equipment Co.

Robert Guidoni and Mary McDonough were married Aug. 28, 1954 in Butte. Mr. and Mrs. Guidoni and family, Ann Marie, 10, Frances, 7, and James, 8, moved to Whitefish in February from Great Falls. He was a member of St. Charles Catholic Church.
