H. E. (Buzz) Inks, 73, of 307 Center E. California St., died Tuesday morning in Flathead Health

Mr. Inks was born Dec. 15, 1900, in Salem, Neb., a son of William A. and Lulu Inks. He was graduated from high school there in 1917. He married Helen F. Camblin in Falls City, Neb., Feb. 12, 1938. He was manager of a variety store in Falls City from 1926 until 1943, when they moved to Alamogordo, N.M., where they lived two years.

They first came to Kalispell in 1945 from Alamogordo and moved to Pawnee, Neb., a few months later to operate an automobile dealership. They had made their permanent home in Kalispell since 1947.

He started to work for Kalispell School District 5 in 1948 and was a cabinet maker when he semi-retired in 1973. He was an active outdoorsman and loved to fish and hike.

Mr. Inks is survived by his widow, Helen, at home; a brother, William Inks, Salem, Neb.; two sisters, Mrs. Kar (Margaret) Pop, Humboldt, Neb.; Mrs. Madge Wenman, Alamogordo. He was preceded in death by his parents and four brothers.

Private funeral services were conducted Tuesday night in the Weatherford Funeral Home by the Rev. J. Torrance Harvey, pastor of the Lakeside Chapel. Cremation followed.
