Mrs. Mary-Elisabeth Andrews Zern, 65, who had lived at 87 Konley Dr., died in Kalispell on Tuesday following a long illness.

She was born Jan. 8, 1910, in Waukesha, Wis., a daughter of Arthur and Katharine Lee Burns Andrews.

Mrs. Zern was a graduate of Mount Notre Dame Academy in 1927 and Trinity College, Washington, D.C. in 1931.

She married E. Lee Lochen on Dec. 28, 1936. On May 25, 1959, she was married to Shelton Cornell Zern, Marine General (ret.), in Tucson, Ariz.

Mrs. Zern was on the island of Oahu with her two daughters during the bombing of Pearl Harbor. She was a world traveler, and presently resided in Kalispell.

She was the first state president of the Wisconsin Junior Women's Club; was a Red Cross Volunteer; member of the Waukesha County League of Women Voters; Christian Mothers of St. Mary, Waukesha and the Elks.

In Kalispell, she was a RSVP volunteer, member of the AAUW; the Sons of Norway, the Republican Women's Club, Newcomers Club, Duplicate Bridge Club and the St. Matthew's parish.

She was preceded in death by her parents; two infant brothers; her husband, Gen. Zern. She is now survived by Lee Lochen of San Mateo, Calif.; two daughters, Sandra Kelley of Kalispell and Sheila

Wordworth of Sequin, Texas, and eight grandchildren.

The body will lie in state at 87 Konley Drive from 2-9 p.m. Friday.

Rosary will be recited at the residence at 8 p.m. Friday. Mass of the resurrection will be celebrated in St. Matthew's Catholic Church at 10 a.m. Saturday with Father James Reller as celebrant. Burial will be in the Fort Rosecrans National Cemetery at San Diego on Tuesday.

Mrs. Grace Zurn, 81, of Kalispell, died at the Colonial Manor Nursing Home in Whitefish Tuesday.

She was born June 24, 1893, in the Helena Valley near Helena, the daughter of William and Susan Mills. She had lived on the family homestead there and attended school in Helena. Her father was an early day ox freighter between Helena and Fort Benton, a freight line which he owned.

In 1910, she was married to Herbert H. Glendinning who owned his own shoe repair business in Helena and Great Falls. Two children were born to this marriage, a son and a daughter.

Mr. Glendinning preceded her in death and on Oct. 28, 1936 she was married to William Zurn at Helena. They had homesteaded in the Sunny Slope at Fairfield for a number of years before making their home in Kalispell.

Mrs. Zurn was preceded in death by her husband, William, on July 22, 1965, and by her daughter, Margaret and one brother. She is now survived by her son, Harold H. Glendinning of Kalispell.
