Harold Malcolm Irwin, 61, who had resided in Lakeside, died in Kalispell Wednesday afternoon.

He was born May 9, 1916, in Bowbells, N.D., a son of George and Myrtle Irwin. He had received his education in North Dakota and as a young man had moved to the Flathead Valley where he has since resided.

He had been employed as a car salesman for a time and had been employed with the Anacond Company in Columbia Falls for about seven years. He then entered construction work and was last employed with Van Evans of Missoula when he became disabled and retired about four years ago.

He had been a member of the Kalispell Saddle Club and the Pipe Fitters

Union. He was preceded in death by his parents.

On July 23, 1938, he married Helen McCully in Kalispell and is now survived by her at the family home. He is also survived by two daughters, Patsy Steinmatzer, Maple Valley, Wash., and Beverly Smith, Lakeside; six grandchildren; one
