# Dr. James M. Cairns, 68

LIBBY — Dr. James M. Cairns, 68, a Libby physician, died Tuesday morning in the Libby Convalescent Center.

He was born July 24, 1894, in Stahlstown, Pa., and spent his youth in Ligonier, Pa., where he attended the Ligonier Classical Institute. He received his bachelor of arts degree

in history from Valparaiso University, Valparaiso, Ind.; a bachelor of science degree in pre-med from the University of Indiana at Bloomington; his medical doctor degree from Marquette University in Milwaukee, Wis.; and his master of science degree in surgery from the University of Pennsylvania in

Philadelphia. He was senior resident physician at Muridale Sanatorium in Milwaukee and served as assistant to the professor of clinical surgery at the University of Pennsylvania Hospital.

He served with the 318th Infantry in the U.S. Army during World War I in France and was wounded at the Battle of the Argonne.

He married Victoria Richards Nov. 12, 1925, in Milwaukee.

He came to Libby in June 1928 and practiced medicine for many years until his retirement several years ago. He was health officer for both the city of Libby and Lincoln County for many years. As health officer and sanitarian, he instituted the pasteurization of milk in the area and also was instrumental in securing the chlorination of city water and banishing outside toilets within the city limits. His last public service job ended in 1971.

He was a member of the Montana Medical Association and a fellow of the American Medical Association.

He is survived by his wife, Libby; a daughter, Patricia Wilson, Houston, Texas; and two grandchildren.

Services will be held Friday at 3 p.m. in St. John Lutheran Church in Libby with the Rev. John Rasmussen officiating. Burial will follow in the Libby Cemetery.

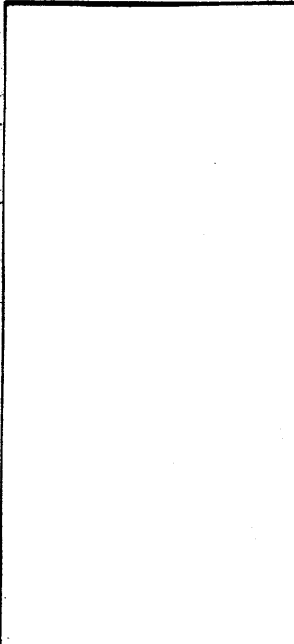
She was born May 12, 1936, at Youngstown, Ohio. She attended school in Great Falls.
