Herbert A. Farley, 68, a member of the Big Sandy Methodist Church, died at the North Valley Hospital Oct. 2.

the Eagles Auxiliary and the VFW Auxiliary.

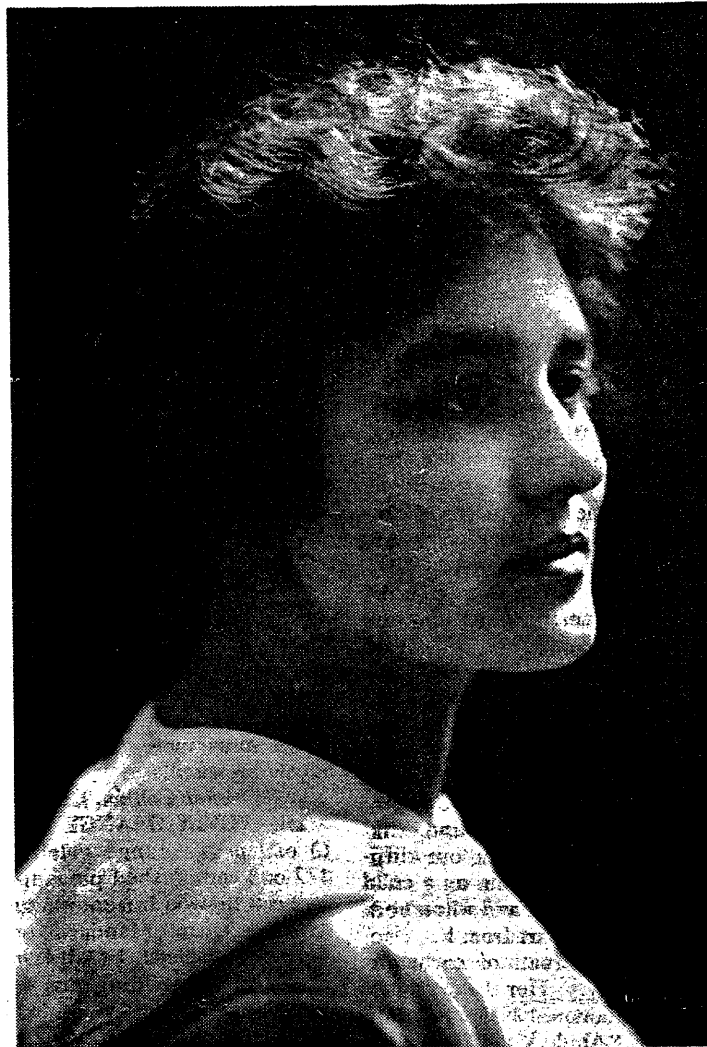
On Dec. 5, 1974, she was married to Martin Feldman in Lethbridge, Alberta.
