

## Hoffman rites conducted

Allen Quentin Hoffman, age 59, a resident of Whitefish, passed away Saturday in Whitefish.

He was born Dec. 19, 1920 in Helena, Montana a son of Walter and Frances Hoffman. The greater part of his younger years were spent at Holter Dam. He attended elementary schools in Craig and Helena, high school at Mission High in San Francisco and graduated from Missoula Sentinel with the class of 1939. Following this he was employed by Northrop Aircraft in Hawthorne, Calif. On May 30, 1941 he married Lorraine Stringer in Las Vegas, Nevada. He was inducted into the Army in January of 1945 and served with the Sixth Army in the South Pacific and on Okina-

wa. He was honorably discharged in July of 1946. In 1949 he and his family moved to Whitefish where he became parts manager and later general manager for Harlow Chevrolet for nine years. Following this he served as Deputy Sheriff for Flathead County and then as foreman of the Street and Alley Dept. for the City of Whitefish. He retired in 1974 due to ill health.
